Through the Bible in a Year Reflection Questions: as we begin our corporate journey through the Bible this year, here are a few questions to reflect upon in your reading. - God made some big promises to Abram and he wondered how he could know that they would happen. What promises has God made to you (or humanity) and what signs of fulfillment has God shown?
- God cared for Hagar and Ishmael even though they were not the ones to fulfill God's promises to Abram. Are there times when you have been outside of God's plan for your life and still seen God's blessing/provision in your life? How so?
- In the stories of Abraham and the angel of the Lord; Lot and Sodom and Gomorrah, we read of both mercy and judgment. How have you have experienced both God's mercy and judgment in your life?
- God tested Abraham by asking him to sacrifice Isaac. Abraham passed the test and God promised to make his descendants numerous and through them to bless all nations. Isaac was reminded of this: Blessed to be a blessing. In what ways are we also called to live out of our blessings to be a blessing to others?
- Abraham sent his servant to his homeland to find a wife for Isaac. The match was discerned through the prayer of the servant and Rebekah's family trusted this discernment. How willing are we to trust in such discernment for matters of this importance? Are there realities that hold us back from trusting such discernment?
- Jacob had an encounter with God at Bethel. Gen. 28:16 says, "When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he thought, "Surely the LORD is in this place, and I was not aware of it." Describe a time in which you were surprised to discover God in the midst of an unexpected place. How can we become more a tune to God's presence?
